SUMMARY









 We can shift our thinking towards inclusion by moving away from the assumption that the factory model of education where students are organized in homogenous, one-dimensional groupings is the goal and towards the assumption that purposefully designed classrooms and schools that maintain the integrity of student diversity reflected in the community is the goal.













 We can shift our practices towards inclusion by moving away from standardization and retrofitting for those students who don't fit and towards designing for a learning community that anticipates variability from the start and allows for student to be agents in their learning journey.
